I had a free afternoon yesterday, and my colleague (Dave) & I decided to do a road trip.

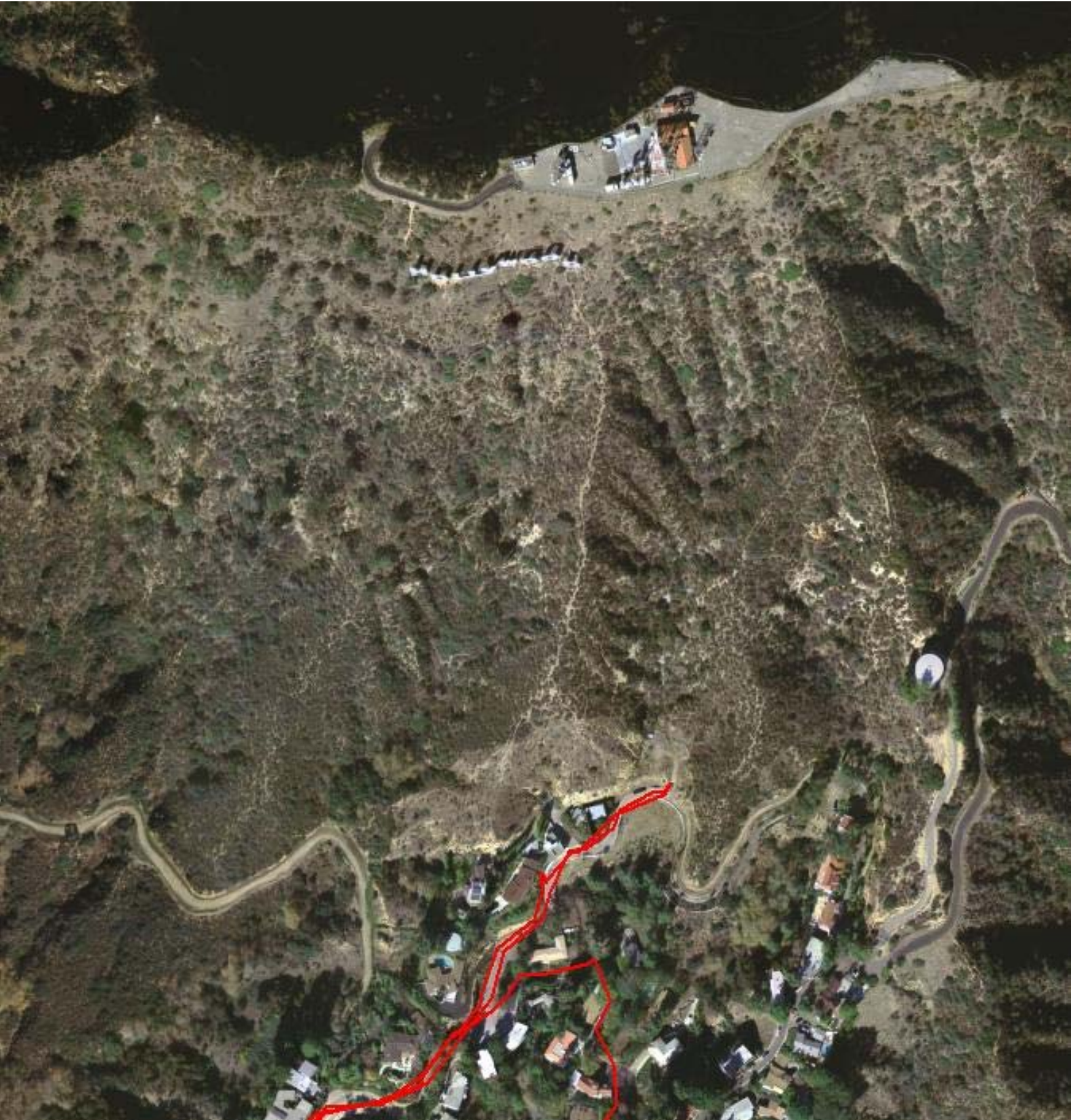
