Hello from New London, Connecticut.

I'm only here overnight, so I haven't done any photo shoots.

But lucky for you, I drove my Tacoma Pickup Truck to Connecticut, and it had the fourth implementation of TacomaCAM recording Time-Lapse video. Unlike previous implementations, this one has the camera on the dash.

I had it set to record one frame every four seconds, playing back at fifteen frames per second. That ends up being a 60:1 time compression.

The trip was 345 miles, and the video is 6 minutes 35 seconds. So if I did the math correctly, the video looks like you are travelling at an average of 3144 miles per hour, or roughly four times the speed of sound (which might make you lurch forward when I stop). So if you are motion challenged, grab a barf bag before watching the video.

I created three versions of the video, in low, medium and high resolution, at 12.5, 28 & 68 megabyte file sizes respectively. Select the one that fits your "waiting to download" tolerance level.
