Hello (see attached, I'm waving out the window).

I took a road trip to Falmouth, Cape Cod, Massachusetts last week, home to the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institute. No opportunities to sight-see, but I took an estimated 67,710 images during the round trip drive using TacomaCAM6™.

The map shows the track, the green segments show the differences between the drive up and back.

Attached are some stills extracted from the videos. I think the best thing I captured was when I was driving South passing the Newark International Airport on the New Jersey Turnpike. There is a long stretch of straight road that goes under the approach to runway 4R, and several aircraft can be seen coming in to land.

And note on the return trip at the first refueling stop, I pull up behind a red pickup truck at the pumps. These guys were having a bad day. Not only did they lock the keys in the cab (you can see them trying to jimmy the passenger door open with a wire coathanger), but worse, they had just filled up their diesel truck with gasoline.

And last but not least, something new for those of you who are Google Earth Proficient. The round-trip GPS path is contained in the attached ".kmz" file. If you have Google Earth, it should come up when you open this file.
